### 1. March Meeting Summary

• The March meeting summary was adopted

#### 2. Updates

- Hoodsport
  - Prior to making a decision on an upgrade, DOH will need additional information on the current properties conducting repairs as part of the enforcement process.
    - The Port of Hoodsport is starting OSS repairs this month
    - Sunrise Motel is going to litigation.
    - The property at 91 Finch Creek Road has replaced their tank and repaired cracked transport line to the drainfield.
    - The Hardware Distillery is installing a new system.
  - The Skokomish Tribe has been waiting for years for a Hoodsport upgrade and is anxious to keep the process moving.
  - ODH will do a sanitary survey of HC 6. There is a 65 day review period. The goal is for the sanitary survey to be completed in fall.
- Big Bend will likely be updated this fall; DOH is waiting for information on deficiencies from Mason County.

### 3. Public Outreach

- The Guidance Group reviewed the draft public outreach materials (1 for the public and 1 for decision makers) and offered numerous comments.
- Haley will update the materials prior to the HCCC board meeting.

#### 4. Final Report

- Leslie provided an overview of the final report and the Guidance Group had a short discussion. Comments were requested.
- The Final Draft report will be presented to the HCCC at the July Board meeting on July 17.

# 5. Board Meeting

- Members of the Guidance Group will be presenting the results of the HCRPIC Phase 3 program to the HCCC board on Wed. July 17 at the Oxford Suites in Silverdale.
- The meeting starts at 1:00 and the HCRPIC agenda item is scheduled for 2:45; however, the times could change so please arrive a bit early.

# 6. Sustainable Funding

- This will be discussed at the August HCCC meeting and will likely be a focus of Phase 4.
- The Guidance Group discussed potential approaches:
  - o PGST: Tribes could get grants to pass through to PIC partners
  - Need to convey to commissioners that local funding enables local control of funds, without the huge reporting/administrative burden that comes with grant funding
  - o Mason Co has scheduled a briefing to their County Commissioners on this topic
  - o Can shellfish growers contribute funding? There may be a nexus with the HC Shellfish Initiative
  - o Now is the time to work on sustainable funding. Phase 4 may be last chance before NEP grants are no longer continued. The future is uncertain.

# 7. HCRPIC Phase 4

- DOH has awarded \$200,000 for two years, which is substantially less than requested.
- The Guidance Group discussed how to allocate the funds.
  - O Skokomish Tribe lab could sub-contract with HCSEG to do lab analysis
  - o Skokomish (WRIA 14/15) could fund adding streamflow monitoring to FW monitoring protocol
  - o Mapping should be focused on useful information for potential upgrades
  - o Kitsap & Jefferson are building field survey databases
  - HCCC offered this rough proposal of budget breakdown, which was supported by the Guidance Group:

- How to celebrate successes during Phase 4?
  - o A Hoodsport upgrade would provide a great opportunity for a celebration.
    - The Skokomish Tribe is very supportive
    - The Port of Hoodsport could be a potential venue
    - There is potential conflict between private property advocates & tribal treaty rights regarding access to shellfish beds if/when reopened. This should be taken into account when developing messaging.
