**HCCC's Scott Brewer transitions to new role** - With the hiring of David Dicks as HCCC's new Executive Director, Scott Brewer will now focus on summer chum salmon recovery as HCCC's Salmon Policy and Science Advisor. Scott will be responsible for developing the guidance and direction for the HCCC salmon program with a primary focus on Hood Canal and Eastern Strait of Juan de Fuca Summer Chum salmon recovery. Working with HCCC staff,consultants, and

partners the position will develop the approach for the delisting and recovery of summer chum salmon. Scott will work closely with the Executive Director advising on matters of environmental science and policy issues.

**USGS** Coastal Storm Modeling System (CoSMoS) page on CHRN website - CoSMoS is the only modeling tool that makes coupled storm and sea level projections widely and freely available. Its use of future climate projections scaled down to predict local coastal hazards makes

the results directly applicable for localized planning and preparedness. More info.

**Dept. of Ecology proposes new and updated limits for toxics in water** - As part of the state's rules for how clean state waters need to be, the aquatic life toxics criteria are designed to protect aquatic life, such as fish and invertebrates, from the effects of toxic chemicals in the water. **New Coastal Quest funding database** - The database includes grant opportunities that support a wide range of coastal multi-benefit nature-based solutions, including disaster resilience, 30×30 protection, conservation, and restoration. More info.
